TA 4 & 5 History Excursion

In Term 2 the students from TA 4 and TA 5 visited the Kalamunda History Museum. It was a very hands-on experience, and our students were able to visit a cottage, classroom, transport museum, blacksmith, post office and the original Kalamunda train platform to learn what it was like to live in the past. These spaces were set up with everyday objects and technology. Children experienced what it was like to share the responsibility of daily chores like: collecting wood, washing, cleaning and making meals. Toilets were very tricky in the past. Students found out that the toilet was outside and in Australia, it was called a “dunny”. We had an awesome day out learning about History.



TA 4 & 5 Visit from Eco Action

We really enjoyed the visit with Lora from Eco Action. Our Science topic for this term is Biology and we have been examining a number of insects in our lessons. Students carefully handled the insects to observe their features. They asked lots of great questions. Many insects were very clever at camouflage and honestly – they were very hard to spot in their habitat.
