CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

I don't know about you, but I cannot believe how quick this term (and 2024 in general) is going.

Christmas craft has commenced in the library at lunchtimes and the students are having a wonderful time decorating ornaments, making cards, writing to Santa, and working tirelessly on their LEGO and colouring creations.

As we approach the end of the year, I find that many children are pushing those boundaries and need clear and consistent expectations to be set and maintained. Here are a couple of tips to help you:

- Establish guiding principles and values.
 It may even be helpful to write these out and have them framed/displayed.
- Explain the reason behind your expectations.
- Ground expectations in reality. Mistakes may happen, but these are perfect opportunities for children to learn.
- Ensure you teach and model these expectations yourself.
- Have clear and consistent correction.
 Ensure that the punishment fits the crime, training them first and never punishing in anger.
- Stick to your boundaries, be fair but consistent and empathise with their emotional reactions.

Above all, make sure they know that you love them regardless, but they have chosen something difficult for themselves and that there needs to be those healthy consequences.
