#### STAFF UPDATE

As you will be aware, Maureen Perry retired from her Associate Principal role this term. We have now concluded the recruitment process of the Associate Principal role, and I am pleased to announce Rebecca Fall from Port Kennedy Primary School will be joining our team next year. Rebecca is currently the Principal of Port Kennedy and holds the substantive Deputy Principal position there. We are excited to have her bring her expertise to the school. Rebecca will be coordinating the Student Services team at Greenwood and assisting with the operational management of the school. To strengthen our Student Services team, we also welcome Naomi Miles in a Learning Support Coordinator role next year. Naomi will continue to work in Kindergarten

one day a week but will also work in tandem with Rebecca to



assist with the smooth running of the Student Services team as a whole. This team is comprised of our Associate Principal, Learning Support Coordinator, School Psychologist, School Chaplain and Education Assistants who collaboratively work to support students across the school. I am pleased to be able to put more resources into this critical area as we begin to roll out new changes across the school that will create positive student outcomes with their social, emotional and academic needs.

In other staffing news, Lorena Bengough who you will know as our Science Teacher, will also work an additional day to provide planning cover in our Preprimary next year. Lorena has conducted this role in other schools, and we know she will do a great job in our early childhood team. Lina Marsland will be taking Term 1 off on long service-leave. Leah Sutcliffe will be covering Lina's role in her absence. Leah has been with us on and off in various roles over the last year and is excited to join the school in an official role for the first term. As she has been with us already and is very familiar with Greenwood Primary School, it will ensure a smooth start to the year for the students.

Lastly, behind the scenes we have been working on numerous positive changes to the way we go about some policies, procedures and processes at the school. It is important when starting in a new school, not to change everything all at once, but to systematically go through and identify collaboratively with staff where positive change can be made, and where outdated or non-contemporary understandings are in place that require rectification. After mapping out all the areas that require improvement, we then begin to work on and outline the change required and then timeline and project map the methodology in which this will occur and the persons responsible for each project to manage each area effectively. Consultation to outside parties and system experts are included throughout the change management process so we can ensure all perspectives where relevant are considered. From the start of next year, we will be making the changes that will be occurring across the school more visible and more transparent

for you, that way we can provide you more information on the fantastic new directions the school will be heading in. Areas of the school physically and digitally will also receive facelifts as we brighten up and refresh our school site.
